**2. Community Complaints including Historical Odour and Dust Complaint Process**

The total number of complaints 2025 YE was presented and 2026 complaints YTD.

Reminder; Complaints that 'Mention Health' are counted when a resident calls with an odour complaint and highlights that they have a health concern. They are not separate complaints received by the plant.

**3. Alternative Low Carbon Fuels Update**

St Marys Cement reviewed quantities of fuels used since starting ALCF in 2024 and highlighted equivalent quantities for frame of reference.

**4. Raw materials Sourcing and Usage – Industrial Byproduct Materials**

St Marys Cement reviewed the raw materials that are fed into the process and specifically highlighted the materials that originate from industries in the area and fall into silica, alumina, and iron sources. Videos were shown highlighting the industries which the materials come from and what material properties re desirable at St Marys Cement. Also noted the requirement for approving materials as per the air permit and continuous monitoring of raw materials on site.
